Are you planning to build a fence or replace your furnace?

If you are planning any home improvement projects, you should check with the City to see if you need a permit. Most contractors will know to obtain a permit before starting work, but some don't...or won't. Some common jobs that require a permit are building a fence, replacing your furnace, air conditioner or heat pump, replacing your water heater and building a shed in your backyard.

We also issue business tax registrations to people who conduct business in King City. The King City Municipal Code 5.04.030 states: "It is unlawful for any person(s) either directly or indirectly, to engage in any business within the City without having first registered their business, as provided by this chapter."

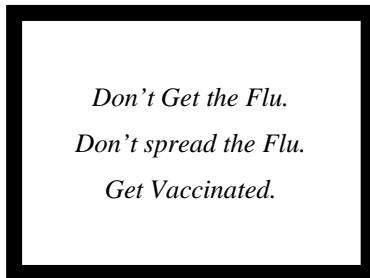

Now is a good time to get vaccinated for H1N1 Flu

Overall flu activity in the United States has decreased during past weeks. While the recent “wave” of infection seems to be past us, there is a real possibility that another “wave” may come along during the regular flu season. The CDC recommends flu vaccine as the first and most important step in protecting against the flu. Supply and availability of the 2009 H1N1 vaccine have increased dramatically. Everyone is encouraged to get vaccinated at this time.



Take these everyday steps to protect your health:

Cover your cough and sneeze with a tissue. Throw the tissue in the trash after you use it.

Wash your hands often with soap and

water. If soap and water aren't available, use alcohol based hand rub.

Avoid touching your eyes, nose or mouth. Germs spread this way. Try to avoid close contact with sick people. If you are sick with flu-like symptoms, the CDC recommends you stay home for at least 24 hours after your fever is gone. Your fever should be gone without the use of fever reducing medicines.

Is your child safety seat installed correctly?

King City Police Department has an officer who is a certified technician in the installation of child safety seats. Officer Codino can assist you in the safe installation of your rear and forward facing as well as booster seats.

It's surprising the number of safety seats that Officer Codino sees that are not installed properly. Spending a few extra minutes making sure that it is installed correctly is worth the safety of your child or grand-

Oregon Safety Seat Laws:

- Infants to ride rear-facing until they reach both one year of age AND twenty pounds.
- Over one year old AND between 20 and 40 pounds must be properly secured with a forward facing child safety seat up to a minimum of 40 pounds or the weight limit of

the seat.

- Children who weigh over 40 pounds must be properly secured in a booster seat until they are age 8 OR 4'9" in height.
- Children who are 8 or older OR are taller than 4'9" must ride properly secured with the safety belt system.

Don't Talk and Drive!

House Bill 2377 prohibits drivers from using a mobile communication device while operating a motor vehicle. This new cell phone law was effective January 1, 2010.

Under the new law, if you are over the age of 18, you may use a wireless device if you are using a hands free ac-

You may not use a mobile communication device to talk or text while operating a motor vehicle.

cessory that allows you to keep both hands on the wheel while you are driving. Drivers that are under 18 may not use a wireless device in any case except in specific situations such as an emergency. Those in violation face a minimum fine of \$142. This

is a primary offense, meaning you can be stopped solely for using a mobile communication device without using a hands free accessory.

The law is intended to improve safety on Oregon roads by discouraging distracted driving.
